Summer means plenty of outside exploration and play! This month's resources highlight summer safety. Make sure your program is ready to splash, cool off and explore SAFELY.

Drowning is the leading cause of death for children ages 1 through 4. The importance of safety and active supervision around ALL types of water cannot be emphasized enough. <u>These guidelines from the</u> <u>American Academy of Pediatrics</u> focus on keeping children safe around water, even when it's NOT swimming time.
