Key Practice Highlight - Quality Improvement System

Each month, DIEEC will share resources that Delaware programs can use as they work towards higher levels of quality in a specific key practice. The key practices support Quality Indicators in Delaware's revised Quality Improvement System.

This month's highlighted key practices support the Creating Conditions for Quality indicator.

- CQ-KP4 (classroom-based programs): Implements practices to recruit and retain high-quality educators, consultants, and contractors and
- CQ-KP6 (FCC): Implements practices to recruit, retain, and orient high-quality educators, consultants, and contractors (as needed).
