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Diversity, Equity and Inclusion Highlight

This month, we're sharing an article that includes strategies for having conversations with children as they notice, and perhaps ask about, the differences between the people in their world: **Talking to Children about Differences and Similarities**.

Children are keen observers of the world. Their curiosity is a useful learning strategy! When they notice how they are similar to and different from the people around them, it helps them construct their own social identities.

Here's one strategy for guiding these conversations; click the link above for more!

"If a child says that a peer's wheelchair makes him look like a robot, you can say, "Some people use wheelchairs to get around, some people use their feet. Both are able to go where they want to go! But people in wheelchairs are people just like you." Have a conversation. Be open to children's questions and curiosity about the differences they notice. You do not need to have all of the answers. It is most important to be willing to have a conversation."

Update: How to Access Former DEPNow Trainings

Three trainings can be accessed through DIEEC using an online platform called Canvas. Please note that the timing for this process has changed-you'll now need to allow up to 48 hours between registering for a course and beginning it. We appreciate your patience as we all navigate this new process together.

Steps to get started:

1.Register for a course

- Health & Safety Training for Child Care Professionals
- Administration of Medication Certification
- Maintaining Equity in Early Childhood: Suspension / Expulsion Prevention

Within 24 hours, you will receive an email titled "UD Guest Account Invitation" from **ziadakir@udel.edu**. Follow the instructions in the email to set up your account.

Video tutorial: Creating Your Canvas AccountWithin 24 hours after setting up your account, you will
receive an email titled "Course Invitation" from Instructure Canvas. Click the "Get Started" button in this
email to log in to Canvas and begin your course.

Quality Improvement Planning

If you are working on a Quality Improvement Award application, be sure that you are referring to the most recent version of the **QIS Program and Policy Guide**. On page 2 of the guide, you will find a summary of the most recent updates made by the Delaware Department of Education.

FY25 Quality Improvement (QI) Award Deadline

The final application deadline for the FY25 QI Award is March 15, 2025. If you are planning to apply by March 15, you should already be working with a DIEEC Quality Improvement (QI) Specialist on a Quality Improvement Plan (QIP).

QI Specialists work with programs on a rolling, first-come, first-served basis. If you have not yet reached out to your QI Specialist or requested support through the **Delaware Early Care and Education Portal**, we encourage you to do so immediately. While we will do our best to accommodate new requests, we cannot guarantee support in developing a QIP in time for your program to apply by the March 15 QI Award deadline if schedules are already full.

QI Specialists are available to support programs in their quality improvement journey regardless of their intent to apply for a QI Award. For more information on the QI process, working with a QI Specialist, or applying for an award, please refer to the **Program and Policy Guide for Delaware's Quality Improvement System for Early Care and Education Programs**.

Quality Improvement Resource Highlight

Each month, we share resources that Delaware program leaders can use to support themselves and their staff as they work towards higher levels of quality.

This month, we're offering resources that focus on mindfulness as a way to create responsive, positive environments for children. When educators practice mindfulness, they are better able to manage stress, stay present in the moment, and respond to children's interests and emotions with warmth and patience. This leads to stronger relationships, more engaging interactions, and a classroom environment where children feel safe, supported, and ready to learn.

- Mindfulness in Head Start Settings, from headstart.gov, provides links to a few different resources to support growth in this area. These resources include:
 - An online learning module (also called Mindfulness in Head Start Settings) through the Individualized Professional Development (iPD) Portfolio. The module focuses on how to include mindfulness practices into your daily routines in your early childhood setting.
 - A mindfulness toolkit filled with exercises for the educator as well as children. There are also additional resources, such as free apps and videos.

Your Quality Improvement Specialist can assist you in selecting the most suitable resources for your Quality Improvement Plan.
