## Meeting the Needs of All Children

Reading with young children and giving them access to a variety of books is essential for early literacy and helps spark a lifelong love of reading. As we choose books, it's also important to consider the messages they send. The images and words children see strongly shape how they view themselves and others.

This helpful guide from Teaching for Change outlines what to look for when selecting books to share. For example, check for harmful stereotypes—oversimplified and often inaccurate generalizations about identity groups. Watch for tokenism, such as only one child of a particular background appearing in a group, and for invisibility, where certain identities or experiences are missing altogether. As stated by the authors of the guide, "What children do not see in their books also teaches them about who matters and who doesn't in our society."

# **Quality Improvement System**

## **Quality Improvement Planning**

The Delaware Department of Education (DDOE) and the Early Childhood Excellence Team have updated Delaware's Quality Improvement System (QIS) Guide. As explained in the email sent by DIEEC on Wednesday, 10/28, programs applying for Quality Improvement Awards should review these changes before submitting a Quality Improvement Award (QIA) application. View the guide HERE; the update history on page 3 offers a concise summary of the changes.

As in previous years, to be eligible for a FY26 QIA, programs must be actively engaged in quality improvement efforts. With the support of a DIEEC Quality Improvement Specialist (QISp), programs will reflect on their areas of growth and build a quality improvement plan (QIP).

Developing a QIP is a multistep process, and requests to work with a QISp will be scheduled in the order they are received. New requests from family child care programs are currently being scheduled for January/February. Contact your DIEEC quality improvement specialist about scheduling.

### **Applying for a Quality Improvement Award?**

Ages and Stages Questionnaire (ASQ) account requirement. As programs prepare to apply for Quality Improvement Awards (QIAs), they should note new requirements for this year. The Office of Early Learning is requiring programs to have an ASQ account and engage in training for the formative assessment tool their program is using (e.g., TS GOLD, Funshine, etc.).

Accessing your ASQ portal. If you need to register or do not have access to your ASQ portal, please use the ASQ Support Request Form. Once your request has been processed, you will be contacted via email with your login information for you to access your portal. You can find step-by-step guidance in the ASQ Provider Manual for Early Childhood Programs, and you can learn more about Developmental Screening by visiting Delaware's Developmental Screening Resources webpage.

**Training for formative assessment tools**. Program staff must engage in the training for the formative assessment tool used. Documentation of training will be accepted in multiple formats based on the training available for that particular assessment tool. Training must be completed, and documentation must be uploaded to the **Delaware ECE Portal** when applying for a QIA. QIA funds may be used to support training on formative assessments that are research-based.

### **Key dates for Quality Improvement Awards:**

- There are two remaining application deadlines: 1/15/26 and 3/15/26.
- To be eligible for an FY26 award, programs must:
  - Hold a certificate or be licensed by the Delaware Office of Child Care Licensing by January 15, 2026, AND
  - Be open and serving two or more children AND
  - Have a visit scheduled with their Quality Improvement Specialist by February 1, 2026.
